BETTY SCOTT HENDERSON PROMOTED TO DEPUTY CLERK/CASE ADMINISTRATOR

Dr. Betty Scott Henderson was recently promoted to the position of Deputy Clerk/ Case Administrator for the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, South District of Nevada.

She is the first African American and will join 10 other Case Administrators who have the responsibility of maintaining and monitoring more than 14,000 official case records for the entire District, in addition to their related adversary proceedings.

Dr. Henderson, an alumni of the Old Westside Elementary School and Las Vegas High School, is the daughter of the

late Nathan Scott, and Ida Scott Webb, of North Las Vegas.

She was the first African American female Deputy Sheriff for Clark County. She moved to the San Francisco Bay Area in the early 60's.

Prior to her return to Las Vegas in 1986, she served as Administrative Assistant for Children's Hospital Foundation in Oakland, California.

She received her Juris Doctorate Degree of Law from Armstrong Law School, Berkeley, California.

She has received numerous awards for her involvement with

She is currently a Training Consultant for the local Frontier Girl Scout Council. Go Bananas With A Fruit Parfait



When it comes to dessert, go bananas with this light, easy Banana Chocolate Mousse Parfait.

BANANA CHOCOLATE MOUSSE PARFAIT

- 1/4 cup boiling water
- 3/8 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 2 Dole Bananas (1 extra-ripe, 1 firm)
- 1/4 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 1/4 cups frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1/2 cup fresh or frozen raspberries

- Pour boiling water over chocolate chips; stir until smooth.
- In blender, puree extra-ripe banana, brown sugar, vanilla and melted chocolate. Blend until smooth. Fold in whipped topping.
- Spoon half of mousse into 4 parfait or wine glasses. Slice remaining firm banana over mousse in glasses. Spoon remaining mousse over bananas. Chill at least 30 minutes.
- Top with raspberries and additional sliced banana if desired. Serves 4.

The organization enjoys observer status at the United Nations.
