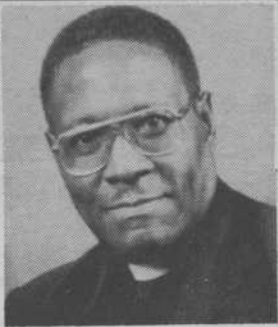

UNCLE TOMISM IS NOT DEAD

Beginning with the slavery of the Black man in America and continuing until today, there has always been, and still is, a few "step and fetch its," grinning at what is not funny; knee jerking and butt scratching Uncle Toms around.

In the history of the Black man's struggle for freedom in America there has always been those who would place their own personal selfish gains above those of the survival and interest of the masses of Black people. Toms come in all situations and circumstances of life. He may be a preacher proclaiming the gospel wearing a turn around collar everyday. He may be a supervisor in an office, or he may be a principal of a school, or he may be a teacher in a classroom, or a worker in a hotel or factory, or he may be a fireman or a policeman, or he may be a laborer or in management, or in law or

medicine. You will always know who he is because he always finds faults in the Black man, but never finds any faults with his "Massus; that is the man who own his body, mind and soul.

Unfortunately for Tom, as soon as the man finishes using him up, he cuts him loose. Tom never seems to learn any better and ends up worse off than he was before he sold his race to the man for thirty pieces of silver. Even during the days of the Black man in slavery in America, Tom was always present. Sometimes he worked in the Bighouse and sometimes he worked in the field. Tom attended church, and neighborhood as well as community meetings for one purpose and one purpose only; to keep 'Massus' informed of what Blacks were planning to do. Upon close observation you will notice that Tom does not have very much to show for all his hard work. Our advice to Tom is to stop selling out, take that stoop out of your back, stand up and walk with your shoulders squared and your head held high; look, talk and act like a man. For this, your wife, children and grandchildren will be proud of you and will call you Daddy rather than Uncle Tom. Tom stop saying what the man wants you to say against other Black men. Tom, if you can't say something good, keep you

Big Mouth Shut! Don't forget Tom, everybody knows who you are and what you are saying and doing.

Remember Tom, if war breaks out (God forbid) every one who looks like you will be in the same boat together. Tom, wake up and come home. Forget about trying to stop the Freedom Train for Black men, from rolling. Tom listen to the pledge of allegiance to the flag that does not apply to you.

I plead allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all; but not you Tom. If you need us Tom, call us. You may need us sooner than you think.

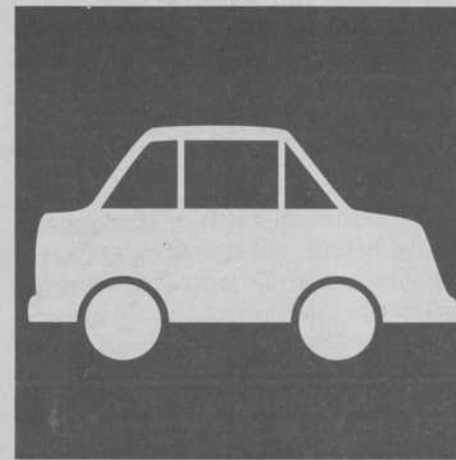

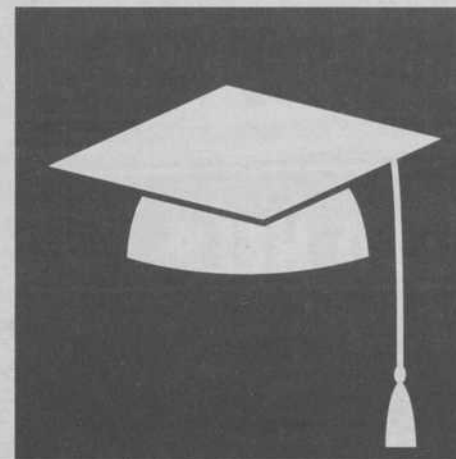
