As most of you know, although I am originally from the East Coast, I am currently a college administrator based in LA County. One week after LA erupted, I was invited to speak at a college forum which was designed to reflect on the situation.

The following were some of my thoughts and comments. Some time has passed, but I offer this two part column as another point of reference for an important period that college students are entering.

Yes, the Rodney King beating, the Rodney King whipping was and is about class and ethnicity, but less about class in my view. Just ask Wesley Snipes, Blair Underwood, Lavar Burton, Don Jackson, Al Joyner, etc.

When the verdict was handed down and the city erupted, one of the easiest things that I could have done was rush to an open mike and declare myself to be the leader of African American students. Some prominent personalities did. That would have been one politically correct thing to do.

But I try not to make decisions based on election time, tenure time or show time. I am not, however, suggesting that most of the people who immediately protested were insincere. In fact, many excellent points were registered.

No, my office didn't rush to the mike or to be at the head of the protest rally. We did, however, encourage students to express their outrage of the verdict by any means that they deemed appropriate, such as marches, rallies or classroom discussions.

At the same time, we officially chose to utilize and encourage students to use another time proven strategy. "Keep your eyes on the prize".

## School Improvement Brochure Sent Home With Students

A brochure detailing almost \$90 million in improvements to Clark County schools as part of the district's bond issue is being sent home with all students.

Brochures are being distributed to inform parents and the community about the many improvements under way at existing schools, in addition to new schools that are being built to accommodate rapid growth.

The brochure explains how

all Clark County schools benefit from the \$600 million bond issue approved by voters in 1988. An estimated \$87.9 million - almost 15 percent of the total bond issue - is being spent to improve schools. The brochure also lists the type of improvement projects and the number of schools where a particular project is being completed.

Improvement projects are farreaching, from school additions consisting of several classrooms to additions of new libraries at elementary schools and science and computer labs at junior and senior high schools.

Many schools are undergoing replacement of heating, ventilation and air-conditioning equipment, while systems for fire alarms, clocks and telephones are being upgraded at other schools.

restrooms are being modernized, lighting and landscaping are being improved, and roofs are being replaced.



Eighty-two of the 482 graduates received their diplomas with honors. The university awarded 94 Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy, 110 Masters, and 6 Doctor of Pharmacy degrees.

Fifty Xavier graduates have already been accepted into medial and professional schools while twenty-five have been accepted into graduate schools. Xavier is second in the nation in placing black students in medical school.
