After a decade of her life spent in Johannesburg, South Africa, artist Atara-Baker moved to California and began a series of paintings about a subject she knew best: Africa. And for Atara-Baker, Africa was best represented by masks.

These highly abstract works are usually done on approximately 40"x48" canvases and are often created by erosive and additive techniques including scratching and scrabbling in the wet paint, and building the surface up with layers of newspa-Del

Ms. Atara-Baker feels her work constitutes a contemporary perspective on the relationships of color and pattern in tribal societies such as that of the Bushman (san) people of the Kalahari Desert whom she was most drawn to.

The artist says, "this work is an interpretation of my life's ex-

periences in particular those of South Africa, and reflect a search for the primeval in oneself and liberation from the constrictions of modern society.

They attempt to scratch at the surface of the present to reveal personal and ancient cultural memories."

The Los Angeles Times art critic Leah Ollman stated that these paintings compress time into a dense, abraded surface, each canvas confronting the viewer with a face, willing to show

its scars but not to tell the stories of their making.
