Lakers against the Boston Celtics. NBA MVP Jordan was supposed to co-star with Portland's All-Pro guard Clyde "The Glide" Drexler throughout this series however, Clyde must of left his Glide back in Portland. Most of Drexler's gliding occured in the first quarter, highlighted by a flying slam
