statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment dipped 0.5 percentage points in April to 6.0 percent, - the lowest level of the year. Nevada Employment Security Department's (NESD) Executive Director Stan Jones called Nevada's decrease in unemployment a mirror of the moderate economic recovery trend nationwide.

Jones said, "Anover-the-year increase of 15,700 jobs statewide, with 63 percent of that job growth in Clark County, shoresup Nevada's economic recovery." He pointed out, "construction and the service industries continue to lead the state out of the economic morass of 1990-

service industries, including gaming and recreation show an increase of 7,300 jobs over-thevear, while the construction industry showed its current strength totaling 41,100 jobs, 1,000 more jobs reported in the industry than a year ago.

He said the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported the nations seasonally adjusted civilian unemployment rate for April was 7.2 percent. And, neighboring California's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 8.0 percent.

The department's monthly survey show that unemployment throughout the state's 17 coun-

ties ranged from a low of 2.7 percent in Eureka County to a high of 10.3 percent in Esmeralda County due to layoffs at the Homestead Mine. During April, Las Vegas (Clark County) was estimated at 6.0 percent unemployment, down 0.7 percentage points over-the-month and 0.3 percentage points higher than a year ago.

Reno's (Washoe County) April jobless rate was estimated at 5.7 percent unemployment, down 0.4 percentage points during the 30-day period. In April 1991, Reno's unemployment rate was 5.1 percent.

According to the department's labor economists, retail and wholesale employers (including general merchandise, apparel, food stores, auto dealers, service stations, eating and drinking establishments) accounted for an estimated

3,400 jobs when compared to the same time a year ago. The mining industry employed a reported 13,300 workers during

- 100 fewer workers than April a year ago. And, employment in manufacturing picked up 100 jobs since April 1991, with 25,900 workers reported.
