Ms. Sanchez is a recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts; the Community Service Award from the National Black Caucus and the 1988 Governor's Award for Excellence in the Humanities. She has lectured at over 500 universities and colleges in the United States and has traveled extensively throughout the world, sharing her poetry. She presently holds the Laura Carnell Chair in English at Temple University.


