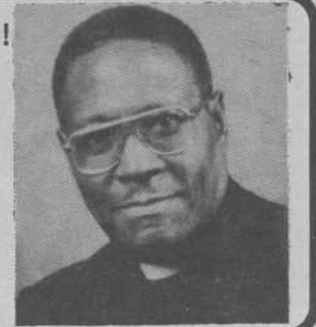

## JOBS PACIFY BUT BUSINESSES SATISFY

The recent rebellion that took place in West Las Vegas on April 29 and 30, 1992 has sent a wake-up signal to all of us, including our Political Leaders.

As an aftermath to this rebellion, Governor Bob Miller of Nevada and Mayor Jan Laverty Jones of Las Vegas have an initial effort to generate some jobs for those who are seeking employment. These efforts are the first steps and undoubtedly will fulfill a temporary need for those who are desperate and down and out.

However, jobs, per say, tend to have a temporary quality; here today and gone tomorrow. The experience of Black People in the American workforce has been a bitter disappointment because they are the last hired and the first fired.

Someone has said that Blacks had jobs when they got off the boat from Africa, but they were deadends. Today we must, in Nevada, face the reality that we live in a state that has legalized rights to work, which means that one can work on a job and receive all of the benefits under the collective bargaining agreement, yet be not required to join the union and pay dues.

Now employees must face in Nevada, another employment impediment called "at will termination" which gives the employer the automatic authority to terminate them without giving any reasons at all.

We are now requesting that the Governor, Mayor, the Nevada Congressional delegation, as well as the County Board of Commissioners, help the business people in West Las Vegas to get going just like they assisted Valley Food on the corner of Bonanza and "D" Street acquired prime land after being given 3,000,000 dollars of the tax players money, while bringing in their workforce and not hiring the local people, businesses have a tendency to last longer than jobs and have a built in quality to create employment opportunities.

We are calling upon these same political leaders to give the business people in West Las Vegas the same level of assistance they gave to Bob Snow when they gave him 17,000,000 dollars to open the Main Street Station.

Remember, Jobs Pacify, but Business Satisfies.
