AKA CONVENTION DATES & FEATURES ANNOUNCED

New Orleans, La. - The first black woman to sit on the Georgia Supreme Court is the lead off speaker for the fifty-fifth national meeting of Alpha Kappa Alpha (AKA) July 18-25 in New Orleans.

Scheduled to make appearances in addition to Justice Leah Sears-Collins are Secretary of Health and Human Services Louis Sullivan, General Colin Powell, Madame Leah Tutu,

Rep. Cardiss Collins, BET's Robert Johnson, and Trans Africa's Randall Robinson.

Sears-Collins will keynote the opening public session, 7:30 p.m., Sunday, July 19, in the convention center. AKA award winners Powell, Tutu, Collins, Johnson, and Robinson will also be honored at the event. Powell will receive the Eleanor Roosevelt Medallion of Honor; Tutu, the Service Award to a Foreign

Woman; and Collins, Johnson, and Robinson, the Peace and Justice Awards in law, media, and international relations, respectively.

Sullivan's address at a health forum Thursday, July 24, will be another feature of the convention which is expected to draw 15,000 from throughout the United States, the Bahamas, Virgin Islands, Germany, and West Africa.

A salute to the black press, a

tribute to AKA 75-year-member Lorraine Green of Chicago, a health fair providing free screenings, commencement exercises for AKA's first class of graduate

advisors, and a Model Ivy AKAdeMy profiling major program activities, are also on the agenda. The convention will culminate with an educational ex-

travaganza on Thursday, July 24, where AKA will present a check to the United Negro College Fund to which it has donated more than \$500,000.

DOLLAR & SENSE MAGAZINE SALUTES TOP BLACK BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONAL WOMEN OF 1992

America's Top Black Business and Professional Women of 1992 are announced in the July Women's Issue of Dollars & Sense magazine.

The 88 women featured and being honored during the magazine's eighth annual Tribute to America's Best & Brightest Men and Women are representative of a growing body of

African-American women making outstanding contributions in business, the professions and in their communities.

Young and Successful, 97 percent of these women are between the ages of 25-49; 49 percent earn \$50,000 or more annually; and 47 percent own homes or condominiums valued at \$200,000 or more. The life-

styles of these women are examined in the feature "Young, Female and Successful."

Also highlighted in this annual Women's Issue are four "Very Important Prestigious Women," cited for their distinguished career achievements. They are: Democratic nominee of for the U.S. Senate, Carol Moseley Braun, currently Cook County (IL) Recorder of Deeds; Sarah Burroughs, senior vice president and general manager of the Atlanta office of Burrell Advertising Inc., the nation's largest black-owned ad agency; Ingrid Saunders Jones, vice president, corporate external affairs of The Coca-Cola Company and chairman of The Coca-Cola Foundation, Atlanta; and Joyce C. Willis, assistant vice

president and director of public relations for the \$38 billion ITT Hartford Insurance Group.

As an added bonus, the FASTRAK column, Dollars & Sense's newest department, tells how Emeline King, recipient of the first annual FASTRAK AWARD, made it into the ranks of automotive design at Ford Motor Company.

All of the women featured in the July issue will be honored at a gala weekend awards conference August 14-15, 1992, at Atlanta's Westin Peachtree Plaza Hotel.
