The American League also set an All-Star record with 19 hits and their fifth straight victory over the Nationals.

Griffey Jr., 22, is now 5-for-8 (.625) in three All-Star Games. "It was kind of weird, when I hit it, I didn't think it was going, "admitted the Seattle star. His homerun, which came off of former Valley High School star Greg Maddux, of the Chicago Cubs, was the first by a Mariner All-
