# **ELIGIBILITY POLICY**

The Clark County School District has announced its policy for determining eligibility of children who may receive free or reduced price meals served under the National School Lunch and School Breakfast programs.

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced

Application forms are being sent to all homes with school registration material, with a letter to parents or guardians for free or reduced price school lunch and breakfast meals. To apply for free or reduced price meals, an adult member of the household should fill out the application as soon as possible, cateteria or lunchroom. For school officials to determine eligibility, the household must provide the child's name, the amount of income received by each household member and the source of income (wages, child support, etc.). The signature of an adult household member, and that adults social security number or the word "NONE" if the adult does not have a social security number, must be provided.

If the household currently receives food stamps or Aid for Dependent Children (ADC) for a student, the State of Nevada Department of Human Resources, Welfare Division, will automatically notify the school district of the students eligibility for free meals. No application

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has foster children living with them and wishes to apply for meals, an application should be completed.

The information provided on the application may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program

Children of parents or quardians who become unemployed are eligible for free or reduced price meals during the period of unemployment, provided that the loss of income causes the household income during the period of unemployment to fall at or below the levels shown.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price policy, the Determining Official, Kent D.

Sheetz, will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If he wishes to make a formal appeal, he may make a request either orally or in writing to the Director of Food Services, Dan McPartlin, for a hearing to appeal the decision.

If the family size or income changes, the family should complete a new application for each child.

Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for reduced price meals, if the family income falls at or below

the levels shown.

The information provided by the family is confidential and will be used only for purposes of determining eligibility and verifying data.

If the operation of school nutrition programs, no child will
