Study my son, Pursue an education so that you can become a student in the global society. Listen my child to the voices around you so that you will be able to discern the truth. Train your body, young man, so

the physical challenges of life. Learn to write, David, so that you can express your thoughts on paper and use the pen as your sword. Also, do not be afraid, Kedar, to come in touch with what you feel, for the beauty of being can be found in the process of becoming sensitive. But above all believe in yourself. So that one day you will structure something for the development of your people and be an instrument for human progress.
