University of Southern California (USC) School of Cinema, UCLA College of Fine Arts, University of Wyoming, and the American Film Institute (the latter also recieved a separate check to go toward AFI's Annual Film Festival) were recipients of HFPA Scholarships.

Donations from the Holly-

wood Foreign Press Association went to Margaret Herrick Library (the Academy Library), KCET-TV, Actors and Others for Animals, the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences Foundation (John H. Mitchell Student Internship Program), AmFar's Project Lifeline (Aids research), Life is Feeding Everyone (L.I.F.E.), UCLA's Film & Television Archives, the American Cinematheque, the International Academy of Performing Arts, Hollywood Supports, Young Musicians, and the Community Youth Gang Services' Job Development Program initiated by actor/director/activist Edward James Olmos.

Presenters of the various donations were Lynn Cartwright, Martin Landau, Ann Miller, Ricardo Montalban, and Donald O'Connor. Due to the organization's 50th Anniversary of the Golden Globe Awards, a num-

ber of those who have helped to create the magic of Hollywood were invited as special guests. Roger E. Mosely, Virginia Capers, Anna Lee, Virginia Mayo, George Montgomery, Patricia Morison and Cesar Romero were among those invited as special guests.

The 50th Annual Golden Globe Awards ceremonies will take place on Saturday January 23, 1993. Nominations will be announced on December 29th, 1992.

"STIFF CHARGES FILED AGAINST JANET JACKSON'S SUITOR....."

The stalking suitor who threatened to kill Janet's super star brother Micheal Jackson and President Bush a couple of months ago to get the attention of recording star Janet Jackson, who he claims is his wife, is apparently going to get plenty of time to think everything over!!

Frank Paul Jones, 33, a New York resident was arrested June 22nd on the grounds of Janet Jackson's parents home in Encino. The misdemeanor stalk-

ing and trespassing charges in Van Nuys Municipal Court were dismissed last week so federal prosecutors could proceed with charges carrying much stiffer penalties.

Jones was charged with using the mails to communicate threats, a charge that carries a five year prison term and a \$250,000 fine. According to U.S. Attorney, Gregory W. Jessner, "additional charges will likely be included in an indictment to be presented to a grand jury in the next several weeks."

Federal authorities consider this case serious because Jones came close to carrying out his threats on several occasions, including the trespassing incident.

A month before his arrest at the Jackson family estate in Encino, Jones was arrested by White House police for attempting to get Janet Jackson's attention, according to an affidavit filed in support of the charge. The incident came a day after he wrote a letter threatening to kill Bush, the affidavit states.

"Since no one is taking me serious, and I can't handle my state of mind, I'm going to Washington, D.C., to threaten to kill the President of the United States, George Bush," the letter states. "If they don't arrest me or solve my problem I'm gonna attempt to kill President Bush.

According to the affidavit, Jones also threatened to kill entertainer Micheal Jackson to get Janet Jackson's attention.

On the brighter side of things, Ben Vereen was released last week from UCLA Medical Center, where he spent six weeks recuperating from a near fatal automobile-pedestrian accident
