

Many of the same people who consider welfare a waste and a ripoff may be unknowingly causing billions of taxpayer dollars to be flushed down the drain. And add insult to injury, their actions place a financial burden on every household in America

Is it really possible to put a price tag on racism? Can you actually calculate in dollars and cents the host of racial bigotry in America?

Yes you can. According to some leading national economists, racism is estimated to cost this nation close to 2 percent of the Gross National Product, or some \$93 billion dollars. That's \$1,000 for every family. Money wasted, because it ultimately has to be paid by you and me. Can you believe this boondoggle?

These figures are not pie-in-the-sky. They are fact-based. If you examine the end-product of racism it is evident that many African-Americans and other so-called racial minorities are a squandered human resource

Conservatives are frequently critical of what they call the "welfare mentality" of the underclass, seldom if ever stopping to think that inclusion rather than exclusion of minorities would create a better standard of living for us all.

Many employable African Americans stop seeking work after being repeatedly rejected. Even Blacks with jobs frequently encounter subtle and overt discrimination.

Women fare better than racial minorities in securing senior executive jobs. Women hold 3 percent of the nation's top corporate jobs. By comparison, minorities hold only about 2 percent of top management positions.

Looking at the financial bottom line, it's a case of "pay me now, or pay me later." Can this nation afford to continue throwing good money after bad? If the bottom line of business is to maximize profits, and it is, how can we justify an expensive proposition like this because of racism? To know is to grow. Until next week.

Robert White, an 18-year-old recent high school graduate from St. Louis could have been another inner city statistic—a young black male under-educated, incarcerated or dead because of drugs. Instead, with the help of teachers, a special program for minority science students and mentoring by a noted African-American chemist, he is on the road to joining the elite statistical group of black

One of 2,000 students competing in the NAACP's 1992 National ACT-SO (Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological and Scientific Olympics) competition, Robert's research project is entered in the chemistry division.

Four years ago, Robert was basically on his own and a world away from ACT-SO. He credits caring teachers who "snatched knots" out of him with steering him toward a diffrent direction.
