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American Studies. The newly elected DST president is a former vice-president of administrative affairs at Johnson C. Smith University (Charlotte, N.C.). Dr. Maxwell-Roddey has also been on the faculty and staff at the University of North Carolina-Charlotte where she holds the distinction of being the Frank Porter Graham Professor Emeritus. While at UNC-Charlotte, Dr. Maxwell-Roddey was the primary coordinator in establishing an Afro-American Studies Program.

She is a co-founder and board member of the Afro-American Cultural Center in Charlotte and is the founder and ex-officio board member of the National Council for Black Studies.

In her South Carolina community, Dr. Maxwell-Roddey is an active member of the Rock Hill NAACP, works with the State Commission on Alcohol & Drug Abuse and is a deaconess at Liberty Hill Baptist Church. Her other community involvement includes working with Big Brothers, Inc. (character member board of directors),

Johnston Memorial YMCA (board of directors) and the West Point Military Academy's Appointment Committee. In 1980, Dr. Maxwell-Roddey was a candidate for the North Carolina House of Representatives. The Delta national president is a member of Charlotte Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority; she has served as president of that chapter.

The other top ranking Delta officers elected at the Baltimore convention were Marcia L. Fudge, Esq. of Warrensville Heights (OH) as national first

vice president; Khadija Fredericks of Richmond (CA) as national second vice president (an undergraduate position); Louise Rice, Ph.D. Of Augusta (GA) as national secretary and Barbara Moseley-Davis of Mitchellville (MD) as national treasurer.

other 400 are new positions that result from the district's continuing growth. Because plans for third-grade class-size reduction were put on hold, no new teaching positions were created as a result of class size reduction, which had been the case the past two years..

Class size reduction, in addition to attrition and growth, was a factor in teacher hiring for the

1990-91 and 1991-92 school years. Approximately 1,100 new teachers were hired for 1991-92, when second-grade class size reduction was implemented, and about 1,300 teachers were hired for 1990-91, when first-grade class size reduction was implemented.

New teachers reported to school August 13. The first day of classes is August 24.

(Continued from Page 1) she earned \$20,821-\$121 more than the maximum amount of eligibility.

In the mean time, campaign contribution and expenditure reports filed earlier this week showed that Pearson had collected \$255,750, compared to Atkinson-Gates' \$133,913.

Circus Circus, the Boyd group, Hilton Nevada Corp., and Palace Station all contributed monies to both parties.

Some donors such as: All-State Rental Car, Caesars Palace, the El Cortez Hotel, the Gold Coast Hotel and MGM Grand Inc., to name a few, donated monies to Pearson's campaign.

Donors who contributed only to Atkinson-Gates and not Pearson included Bally's Casino Resort, Las Vegas Sands, Tropicana Resort and Railroad Pass Hotel.

Pearson has spent \$222,000 of his money, and Atkinson-Gates has spent \$7800 of hers.

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
