AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY

JAMES LANGSTON HUGHES (POET)

James Langston Hughes was born in Joplin, Missouri. He began his college education at Columbia University, where he left before graduating to travel around the world. He later received his B.A. from Lincoln University.

Hughes was considered one of the most productive writers of the 20th century. He wrote about his experiences gathered in the 1930's in trips to Africa and Europe by the way of the West Coast, China and Liberia.

His works have now been translated into more than 25 languages including French, German, Spanish, Bengalese, Gujarati and Hindi.

Hughes wrote poems, novels, plays, biographies, histories, essays and books for children. His works garnered him such honors as the Witter Bynner Prize for Excellence in poetry in 1926; both Rosenwald and Guggenheim Fellowships, the Anisfeld Wolfe Award in 1953 and the NAACP's Spingarn Medal in 1967.
