**NEW SAFEKEY
SITES ADDED**

The K.R. Booker and Madison Sixth Grade Centers are two of the latest sites to be added to the growing number of Safekey programs county-wide. Programming at these schools begin with the opening of the new school year on August 24.

Unlike elementary schools where only children from the immediate school may attend, the Booker and Madison sites will accept students from their own campus and surrounding elementary schools. The program runs weekdays 3:30-6 pm, and is for grades K-6.

Several pre-registration opportunities are available; the Doolittle Community Center, 1901 North "J" Street, accepts registration 3-7 pm, August 17-20, while the Brinkley Community School, 6150 Smoke Rancho Rd., will take sign-ups 3-7 pm, August 17-21. The cost is \$5 per month, per family. Children who live in Housing Authority Developments may attend the program free of charge.

Safekey is the before and after-school recreation/enrichment program designed to assist working parents with child-care needs. The program is administered by the City of Las Vegas Department of Parks and Leisure Activities in cooperation with the Clark County School District, and the Department of Parks and Recreation for Boulder City, Henderson, and North Las Vegas. The program includes assistance with homework, daily snacks, and recreational periods. Call 646-9046.
