

GORE ADDRESSES THOUSANDS OF SUPPORTERS DURING A BRIEF STOMP IN LAS VEGAS

Vice Presidential hopeful, Senator Al Gore (D) TN, was in Las Vegas on Monday, August 31, 1992 at 12:45 p.m. to participate in a local private fundraiser before addressing thousands of Clinton/Gore supporters at a rally on the UNLV campus between the Judy Bailey Theatre and Artemis Ham Hall.

Local government, state and federal officials as well a political hopefuls were on hand to rally the crowd.

The rally kicked off with a crowd stirring performance by the Bishop Gorman High School Band and UNLV's band with Senator Gene Porter serving as Master of ceremonies.

As the crowd swelled and

anxiously awaited the featured speaker, Clinton/Gore signs were passed out and displayed as a host of Secret Servicemen, UNLV campus Police and some private security guards secured the staging area and perused the crowd, and parking lots.

Some of the dignitaries present included U.S. Senator Harry Reid - who introduced Senator Gore, U.S. Congressman James Bilbray, Governor Bob Miller, Senator Joe Neal, Senator Vergiels, Secretary of State Frankie Sue Del Papa and Las Vegas Mayor Jan Laverty Jones, among others.

Imperial Palace's "Legends in Concert" performers entertained the crowd with their "Blues Brothers" impersonation of the

late John Belushi and Dan Akroyd. Senator Reid said, "we don't need speeches about family values." He said that Senator Gore's family was a good example of those values.

Senator Gore thanked the government officials and the Clinton/Gore campaign committee and volunteers before urging the crowd to wholeheartedly

support Senator Reid in his re-election bid.

Gore said that the Clinton/Gore ticket stood for "change."

"You know what they said at the Republican Convention? They asked for four more years. Say we should give them four more months and that's it, he said. Gore tended to echo the economic issues which is where

the Bush/Quayle ticket is most vulnerable. He said that the country can not stand another four years of a "READ-MY-LIP," recession.

Gore emphasized how President Bush's administration favored the rich and the powerful and the privileged few, while turning its back on the middle

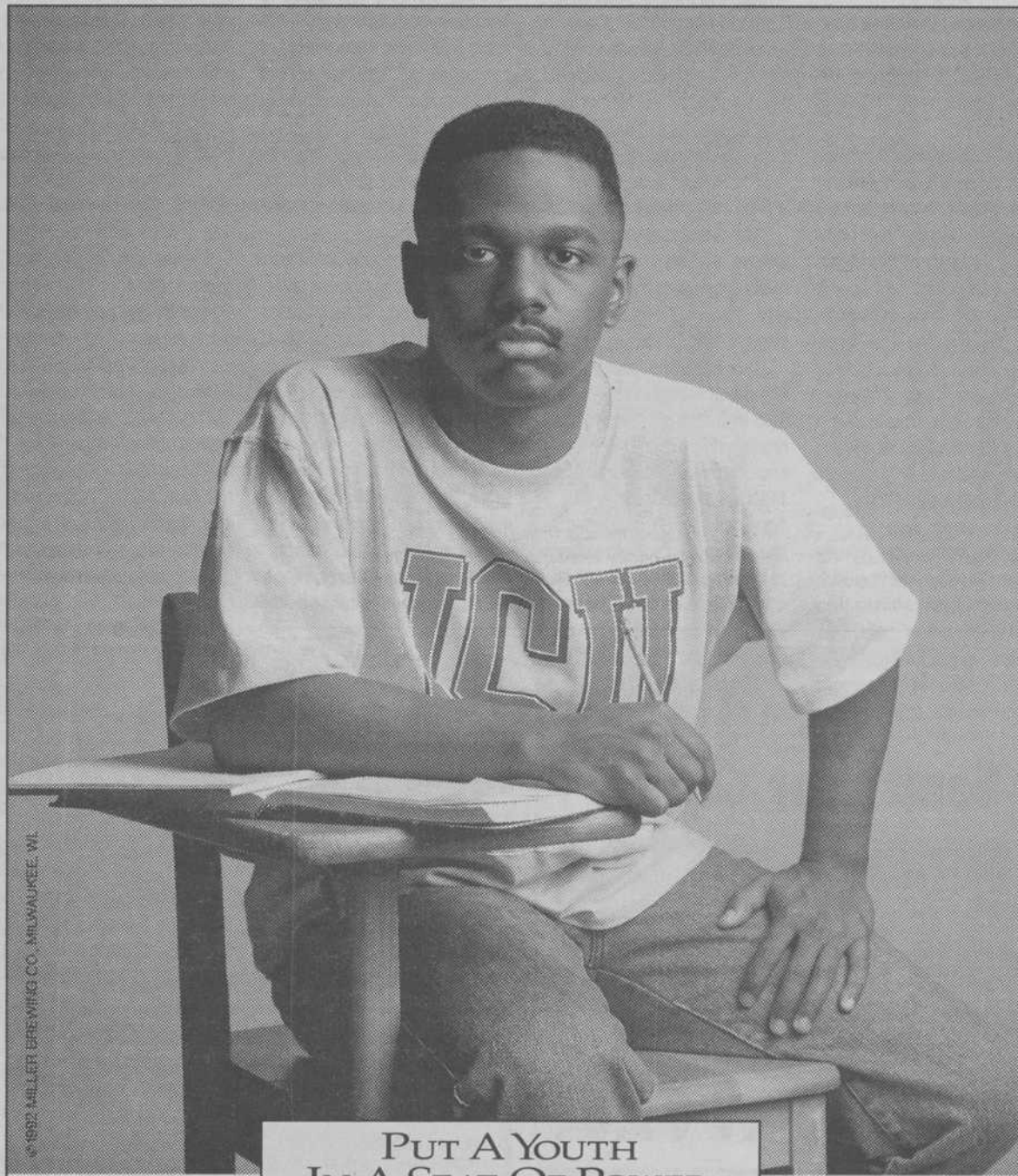
