The Internal Revenue Service is offering free tax return preparation for prior and current year unfiled returns. The assistance is provided through the IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program as part of a Compliance 2000 project to bring non-filers into compliance with tax law.

It is not too late to file prior year returns and forms for those years are stocked in the local IRS office. They can also be ordered by calling toll free 1-800-829-FORM.

Returns will be prepared in the IRS office at 4750 W. Oakey Blvd. on Mondays from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon and on Thursdays from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.. Other locations are the Las Vegas Library, 833 Las Vegas Blvd. N. (across from Cashman Field) on Wednesday and the Charleston Heights Library, 800 Brush Street (off W. Charles between Decatur and Jones) on Fridays.

The library locations prepare returns between 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. appointment only. Call 455-1212 for an appointment. Assistants at that number can also provide information on how to obtain lost or misplaced W-2 and 1099 information.
