lenting drought conditions now prevalent in the horn of Africa region. Over 2,000 children are now dying daily from hunger. An estimated 60% of the 6 million population are at substantial risk of starvation and death if massive amounts of food aid, medicines, shelter and other emergency assistance is not rendered in the next 30 to 60 days. Bishop William H. Graves, chairman of the Congress of National Black Churches, is hopeful of generating massive church support for the people of Somalia. Said Graves, "The crisis in Somalia has now reached biblical proportions. Millions of dollars in aid must be forthcoming from churches around this country if we are to stop the dying."

Also, participating in the meeting and providing technical input were representatives of the U.S. Department of State, U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), Organization of African Unity (OAU), United Nations, and AFRICARE.
