Norris, who has been labeled as the man to send Sugar Ray Leonard and Donald Curry into retirement, is coming off of a 4th round TKO victory over Meldrick Taylor this past May.

Until he lost the WBC welterweight title to James "Buddy" McGirt last November, Brown devastated the welterweight division, toppling the likes of Shawn O'Sullivan, Maurice Blocker and Tyrone Trice, from whom he captured the IBF title in 1988. Brown throttled Blocker until the bout was stopped in round 10 to earn the WBC belt.

The fight is being presented by Caesars Palace and Main Events, in association with Al Goosen/Ten Goose Promotions, Inc., and Don King Productions,

In 1984, when names such as Randall Cunningham, Tony Gladney and Kirk Jones invaded the Big West competition, the Rebels opened the season 3-0 until being interrupted by a Hawaii defeat by the score of 16-12; UNLV went on to win their next seven games en route to the Big West title and a California Bowl victory.

Since then the Rebels have only captured one season-opening victory and have only finished with a season-finishing record at .500 pct. or better.

Eight years later, Head Coach Jim Strong and his Rebel squad have opened their campaign with two straight victories,

they lead the Big West in three statistical categories and fall in the top three in five other categories. UNLV went to 2-0 with a 40-7 victory last Saturday over Northern Arizona at the Silver Bowl.

The motto this year is "Make It Happen;" The question, "Will They Do It?," is slowly diminishing as they hit the trail and begin a three-game road-swing.

The Rebels' first stop will be in Eugene, Oregon where they'll face the Ducks.

The University of Oregon holds a 1-2 record, 0-1 in the Pac-10, and will throw their highpowered offense at UNLV's extremely tough defense.

The Rebels, currently ranked

first in Scoring Defense, are holding their opponents to an average of 12.0 points per game. In the nation, UNLV ranks ninth in the same category. Strong safety Donnell Porter was named Big West Conference's Defensive Player Of The Week after an impressive display of football last week against NAU.


Porter played out of position, at linebacker, when Rumone Hilton was held out of action against the Lumberjacks. Donnell responded with 8 tackles, one interception, one pass deflection, and returned a blocked punt
