Johnson said his support for Clinton went beyond the issue of AIDS. "I'm not just talking about HIV and AIDS, I'm talking about the whole economy, the whole thing, we need change," said Johnson.

CARSON CITY— Nevada's statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment gained twotenths of a percentage point in August, Stan Jones, executive director of the Nevada Employment Security Department (NESD) announced recently.

"Considering all data generated to compile the statewide unemployment rate, what we see is an economy that remains 'struck' on a plateau," Jones said.

Despite signs of moderate recovery in gaming revenues and taxable sales, "statewide job growth of 1.8 percent over-theyear is nearly stagnant," Jones

said. On a positive note, he pointed out, that the service industries show the largest gain with 4,300 new jobs over-the-

Jones said the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported the nation's seasonally adjusted civilian unemployment rate for August at 7.6 percent, down onetenth of a percentage point overthe-month. And, neighboring California's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 9.8 percent, up ninetenths of a percentage point during the same time period.

NESD labor economists


monthly survey shows that seasonally adjusted unemployment estimates throughout Nevada's 17 counties ranges from a low of 2.2 percent in Eureka County to a high of 11.2 percent in Esmeralda County. During August, unemployment in Las Vegas (Clark County) was estimated at 7.0 percent, down three-tenths of a percentage point over-the-month, and up 1.6 percent when compared to a year ago. Reno's (Washoe County) August jobless rate was estimated at 7.2 percent, up twotenths of a percentage point during the same 30-day period. In August 1991, Reno's unemployment rate was 4.5 percent.

All but one of Nevada's industries are showing some measure of modest over-theyear job growth. The mining industry remained steady (no gain, no loss) with 13,800 jobs reported during August.

Those industries showing over-the-year job growth include:

Service industries (gaming, recreation, and hotels; personal; business; medical and health; legal, engineering, accounting and management) report gaining 4,300 jobs
