According to Luther, "there are many groups that are putting on concerts in South Florida for victims of the storm. However, none of the monies raised will go to the Blacks in South Florida. Artists such as Gloria Estefan is putting a show together that will raise money for the Hispanics, and there is a variety of country western groups that will raise money for the Caucasians...so we Black Artists need to raise money for our people. We have blacks all over the city that need our help. I'm willing to put up the money for a venue in Miami, and 100% of the proceeds will be donated to Black families that were affected by the hurricane. I am also ready to do all the legwork necessary to produce a major fund raising show to aid black families



that were affected by Hurricane Andrew here in South Florida.
