when they travel to New Mexico St. this Saturday. The Rebels, (3-1, 1-0 in BWC play), are coming off a big victory over the Pacific Tigers in Stockton, California.

DB Jason Davis was named Big West Defensive Player Of The Week after two key interceptions and seven tackles against the Tigers.

Davis returned his first interception for a 26-yard touchdown and sealed the 21-17 win with an interception in the end zone during the final seconds of the game.

LB Marvin Robinson also had two interceptions against Pacific. The freshman started the first
