tion, the date the investigation will begin, an estimation of how long it will take, how extensive it will be, and notification of its conclusion and its findings.

"He may not have made these statements," Richardson said later in the week. "But we need to find out one way or the other."

If the board finds, in its investigation, that the allegations are true, they have the power to penalize gaming license holders for an offense that may be viewed as damaging to the reputation on Nevada gaming.

For example, the Imperial Palace was fined \$1.5 million in 1989 for holding two celebrations honoring Adolf Hitler's birthday.

Gaming Control Board Chairman Bill Bible was not in to receive the letter, and no responses are expected to be made until his return.

Copies of the letter were also sent to the NAACP, the Las Vegas Jewish Federation State Senator Joe Neal, Assemblyman Wendell Williams, and Governor Bob Miller.
