INTERNATIONAL STAR - EARTHA KITT - APPEARS IN GALA BENEFIT FOR NEVADA DANCE THEATRE



Known for her feline charm, her sultry, silken voice, her comedic flair and acting and dancing talents, Eartha Kitt has carved an international career spanning four decades and over 100 countries.

Eartha Kitt brings her one woman show to Las Vegas for one performance only, Sunday,

November 15 at 8 p.m. at Artemus Ham Concert Hall, UNLV. This is a gala benefit performance for Nevada Dance Theatre's 1992/93 season. Local musicians conducted by band leader, Johnny Haig will provide the musical backing for Kitt's performance.

Described by Orson Welles as "The Most exciting woman in the world," Kitt's multi talents were first discovered on Broadway. Her success there led to a recording contract, a succession of hit records, a Grammy nomination, and her first autobiography, "Thursday's Child."

While her career spans theatre, television (she was the original Catwoman in the "Batman" TV series), recording, writing and nightclubs, her vocal versatility is equally impressive. Kitt does not try to categorize her sound. Of her voice she

says, "It's style relates to whatever song I'm singing and whatever story it tells." She has been described as having a "silken voice fired by molten steel - tenderly caressing or vibrant with a hypnotic passionate intensity." Some of Kitt's story-telling hits are "C'est Si Bon," "Old Fashioned Girl," "I Want to be Evil," "Monotonous" and "Santa Baby."

Along with concerts and books, Kitt has reactivated her acting career. Her film career has seen her grace the screen with Sidney Poitier in "The Mark of the Hawk," the late Nat King Cole and Sammy Davis Jr., in "St. Louis Blues" and most re-

cently, with Eddie Murphy in "Boomerang."

Kitt is still as outspoken as she was in 1968, when she confronted Lyndon B. Johnson at a Whitehouse luncheon asking why American boys were being sent to Vietnam. "People thought I was out of place," she says now, "But the president asked me to give my honest opinion. For years after that I had a difficult time getting booked..."

During the summer this outstanding artist performed to capacity houses in Melbourne, Australia with the State Orchestra at the Royal Festival Hall in London.

As part of this fundraising gala evening with Eartha Kitt, Councilman Frank Hawkins will be presenting her the key to the city and a proclamation at a private reception after the performance for patrons who purchase the \$125 tickets.
