three seasons as a player, he appeared in three consecutive Fall Classics with Boston, Minnesota, and Oakland, respectively. He has one World Championship ring to his credit, helping the Twins to the World Series title by hitting .385 against the Cardinals in 1987. His best overall season was 1979 with California, earning American League Most Valuable Player honors with a .296 average and 36 home runs, while leading the league in runs scored (120) and RBI (139).
