The Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Committee of Las Vegas will sponsor an education information telephone line that will be set up and operated by the Westside Action Alliance Korp-Uplitting People (WAAK-UP). This donation to WAAK-UP was done by the committee with hopes of showing support to the community-based organization.

The WAAK-UP efforts since last spring have pushed the agenda of equity in education to new levels of awareness and change. And the MLK committee would like to help more people become involved and informed about WAAK-UP's meetings and plans for the education of children by donating the telephone information line to the group.

COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTER TO OPEN IN NUCLEUS PLAZA

Nevada Business Services in conjunction with educational, social and private organizations will open a Community Resource Center in the previously burned out portion of Nucleus Plaza shopping center during November of 1992. This center will provide job training and placement for West Las Vegas residents. This is the first time a concerted effort has been made to bring job training programs into the neighborhoods.

A portion of the shopping center, has been remodeled and will house the Center. It will serve as a one stop shop for evaluation, job skills assessment, training, retraining and placement. It will be staffed by Nevada Business Services, the Nevada Employment Security Department, Community College of Southern Nevada, The Learning Center, County Social Services, Nevada State Welfare and other agencies. The idea behind the Center is to amalgamate a wide variety of job placement services into one body at one location.

Councilman Frank Hawkins

recently stated that the Community Resource Center is a prime example of how the community is trying to better serve residents of West Las Vegas. "If the people are unable to get the training and help they need to find jobs, then the training and assistance should go to the people. In other words, we're ordering "opportunity" to stand on their front porches and knock. Every one entering the center can be assured of at least receiving an assessment of their job readiness whether they qualify for a particular program or not."

The center will function in this manner. A person desiring help in finding a job will apply in person at the facility. At that time he or she will fill out a single application and complete a single assessment. This initial paper work would then be used to determine which agency or agencies within the center will best serve the applicant's needs and which services they are eligible for. The information would be passed to the appropriate entity. This in-house referral system means that all contacts

could be established at one location instead of shuffling the applicant from agency to agency to receive services as in the past.

The new Community Resources Center will provide classroom space for each of the participating agencies. For example, the College of Southern Nevada will teach basic reading and language skills. Nevada State Welfare will offer their Job Opportunity Basic Skills (JOBS) program for those on welfare. The Learning Center will offer computer skills training for workers eligible for federal assistance. Nevada Business Services will provide job retention workshops, Job Seeking Skills Instruction, Basic Skills Training, and Job Club. In essence, the Community Resource Center will greatly curtail the duplication of services which exist throughout the various job training programs and centralize them for the convenience of job seekers in West Las Vegas.
