statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment dipped twotenths of a percentage point in September to 7.0 percent, Stan Jones, executive director of the Nevada Employment Security Department (NESD) announced recently.

"The statewide drop in the unemployment rate certainly cannot be measured as a trend, and is statistically insignificant," Jones said, explaining that eight of Nevada's 17 counties experienced a slight increase in unemployment.
