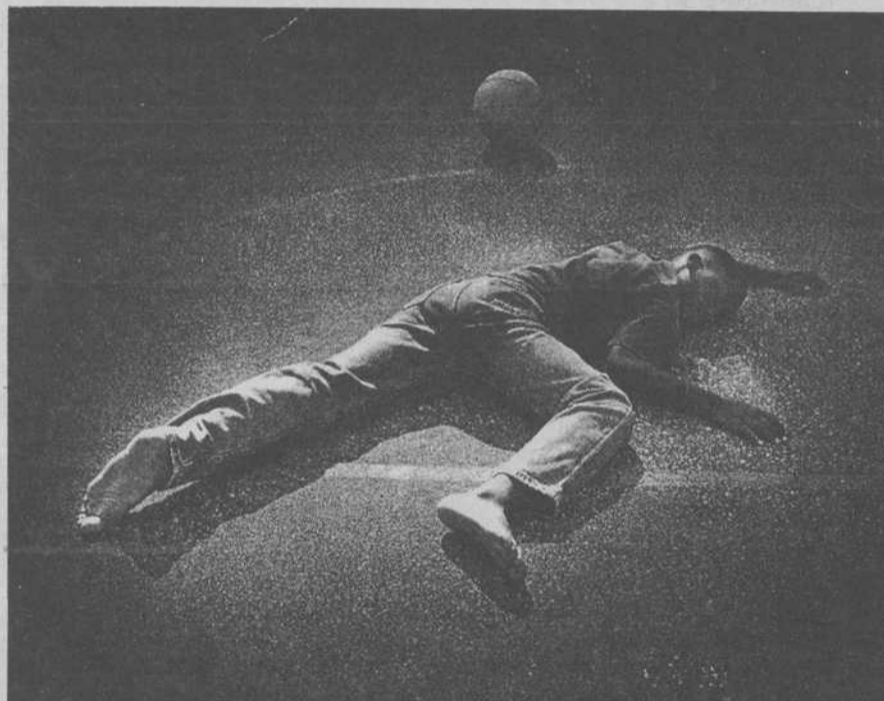

be recruited nationally, the Group Health Foundation expects that most of the fellows will be from the Baltimore-Washington area. Bachelor's level training, a commitment to the health care field and managerial potential will be among the criteria for selection. It is projected that the first group of 12 fellows will enter the program in January or February 1994.

Dr. Sullivan said, "In addition to HRSA and Group Health, I want to congratulate Comprehensive Health Services, a private corporation located in Detroit that is contributing to the project.

This is an excellent example of the way the federal government and the private sector can bring resources together to make a positive difference."



A \$100,000 MANAGED-CARE GRANT has been awarded by the Department of Health and Human Service to the Group Health Foundation of the Group Health Association of America to help train minorities for management positions in HMOs and other manage-care opportunities. Taking part in a recent meeting at HHS about the public-private sector training program were (L to R): Deputy Assistant Secretary for Health Audrey F. will now have to go back to their witnesses and instruct them as to the proper way to tell a lie. It will be, however, difficult for the City to now alter the documents that have already been submitted in this case. The two Highway Patrol Officers who wrote written arrest reports and whose reports read like the two of them were at totally different events at totally different times, will be difficult to counter. The fact that the Nevada Highway Patrol Sergeant who wrote the arrest report and the incident report, appears to be reporting on two different incidents, not on the same incidents, leading to an arrest, will be difficult for the City to counter. Their only hope in this situation is-as stated previously-to make the lie somewhat more believable than it was the first time around.

Clearly, the City of Las Vegas, the State of Nevada, the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Highway Patrol, and the individuals involved in concocting these charges, now find themselves hung out to dry. At best, they are in the worst possible position they can possibly be in relative to civil liability. What they will undoubtedly try at this point, is to improve their position, for indeed, no matter what they do at this point, it must be an improvement since it can't get any worse.
