



LANCERS CRUSH WESTERN

The McQueen Lancers continued their season-long ways by devastating the Western Warriors to claim the Class AAA state championship last Friday at the Sam Boyd Silver Bowl.

McQueen has outscored its opponents 548-43 this season - an average victory of 45-3. The Lancer defense gave up only three touchdowns throughout their '92 campaign.

McQueen's 29 second quarter points put them up 36-0 and became it evident that the Warriors were the ones that would be scalped.

A big, well-balanced team, McQueen completely out-matched the Southern Zone AAA Champions. Western had taken on the role as "Giant Killers" after knocking off the defending state champion Eldorado and then toppling Clark in the zone championship game. Regardless of their outcome against McQueen, Western has put on an exciting display of football. Kudos to both schools, especially to our Class AAA Southern Zone Champions.

McQueen quarterback Todd Floyd passed for 171 yards

completing 15 passes on 23 attempts and 2 TDs. The Warriors whole offense generated only 143 yards, plagued by the Lancers' tough "D." Only two Western of passes were completed after 15 attempts.

The Warriors may only be the state's runner-up, but they just may boast the state's MVP in kicker Randy Lund.

Lund's accurate foot carried Western throughout the season as they baffled opponents as well as skeptics, and this reporter.

They survived the loss of many players to Cheyenne and Cimarron-Memorial and rose to the top of the heap, eventually being ranked, statewide in the Top 5.

Looking ahead to next year, one could only reflect on the success of Green Valley's brilliant turnaround only to fall a playoff game short of the main show.

Questions remain at Valley at Rancho. These two schools were once powerhouse teams in the South and it is a wonder if they can rebuild. Both schools lost players to Green Valley. As second-year teams, Cheyenne and Cimarron-Memorial seemed to take things in stride and may

have a few more years to become true contenders. Las Vegas looked like an offensive force early in the season and eventually slipped to the bottom. Will Gorman ever rise back to the top? Will Clark be just as strong? The Chaparral Cowboys will always be tough - they

just never seem to be there in the end. Bonanza and Basic - these two teams always happen to get caught in the crossfire, yet finish somewhere away from the top.

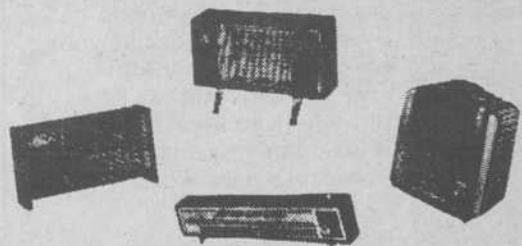
