CIMARRON-MEMORIAL TOPPLES THE 'DEVILS, AT ELDORADO

Defense prevailed Tuesday afternoon as the visiting Cimarron-Memorial Spartans slipped past the Eldorado Sundevils 54-53 in a clash of unbeaten. The Sundevils fell to 2-1 as Cimarron improved to 3-0.

The turnover riddled contest was decided at the free three line as Carlos Morrison sank the front end of a one-and-one with 13 seconds remaining in the game. Morrison's second shot hit the rim hard and Eldorado snatched the rebound and called a timeout after securing possession at their end of the court.

Eldorado's Danny Perez was forced to unload a desperation shot, well beyond the three point line, that missed at the buzzer.

In a losing cause, Perez scored 14 points while teammate Marcus Wade had a game-high 22 points.

Morrison led the Spartans attack with 14 points while teammate Rodrick McClure added 13 points.

• In other contests Tuesday, Bishop Gorman denied Chaparral a late rally by winning 61-57; Bonanza dealt Rancho a 58-51 defeat; Cheyenne drilled Basic with an 85-58 thrashing; In a battle of winless teams, Las Vegas picked up their first win, 70-67, over the Valley Vikings; Green Valley threatened the dominating Western Warriors, but fell short 75-73; Finally, the Clark Chargers devoured Vo-Tech 105-39.

• At press time on Wednesday, seven games were being played. Although details were not available, an early report from Western High School's gym reported that the Warrior's starting point guard, Prince Fowler, had exploded for 48 points against Eldorado. The Warriors won the contest 108-107.
