

**City Councilman Frank Hawkins** Jr., is the umbrella Agency for such Sub Groups as the West Side Neighborhood Advisory Board, West Las Vegas Neighborhood Planning Committee, and many more communitybased groups that are making changes in the area. But the Groups, Agencies, Organizations and Businesses can not do the job alone. They must have our help. And what we can do does not take money. Lets clean up our own property first, especially the main thorough fares leading into and out of West Las Vegas

North Martin Luther King Boulevard, North D,F, and "H" Streets, West Washington and Owens Avenues, are entry-ways to West Las Vegas, and should be free of litter, trash and debris, with well-manicured lawns, trimmed trees and shrubbery surrounding freshly-painted homes.

Below are some home clean up tips we used with the Westside Community Development Commission in an area clean up campaign between 1977 and 1985. Working with the City of Las Vegas Block Grant Program, we refurbished more than 1,000 structures, and the Silver State Disposal Service hauled away all collected trash and debris.

CLEAN UP TIPS: Loose Trash - Box and/or bag in containers weighing not more than 40-pounds. Stack neatly.

Tree Limbs - Tie in bundles not more than four feet long, and weighing no more than 40 pounds.

Old furniture - Stand upright in collection area - stack neatly. Refrigerators and stoves -

Seal Refrigerator doors - stack neatly.

Discarded evaporative cool-



ers - stack neatly. Old automobiles - Call wrecking yard and state the old vehicle is a nuisance on your property or street, and it will be removed free of charge.

Old lumber - Stack neatly. Trash cans do not fill to weigh more than 40 pounds.

Old carpet - cut and tie in bundles of 40 pounds or less.

City Councilman Hawkins has had a clean up crew working in West Las Vegas for more than a month, cleaning up city owned property, and his Adopt-A-Block Program to clean-up and improve the area is being implemented.

PAINTING TIPS: Exterior Trim - One gallon of good grade latex paint will do the

average exterior trim job. Exterior Body Paint - Four gallons of good grade latex paint, computer-mixed, if painting over same color.

Painting temperature - Latex paint works better when applied when temperature on the outside is between 58 and 80 degrees (F).

We cannot, expect Ms. Patri-
