BIG BAND GOSPEL: JAZZ MEETS GOSPEL...

Both gospel and big band music are distinctly American music forms, but only now have they been married. Randall-Keith Horton, an accomplished composer, arranger and conductor, has combined these two musical genres in "Big Band Gospel," a collection of nine spiritual and love songs on the New Sound Records & Tapes label.

The songs, which range from the strong and joyful gospel sound of "The River of Live" to the delicate lyrical "Family," all proclaim a love of God and rightful living. The love songs also place the love between man and women within the larger embrace of God. Horton has broadened the traditional interpretation of gospel. In doing so he has also made an incursion into popular music. The result is a new music, one which offers African American young people especially, an alternative to the often destructive messages in rap and rock. Horton has filled a void.

This "Big Band Gospel" CD and cassette features the Randall-Keith Horton Gospel Orchestra sometimes by itself, sometimes with soloists, and sometimes with the 19-voice Rakeiho Gospel Singers. Two of the songs feature exquisite

soprano solos by the Rev. Diane Moffett, pastor of Elmhurst Presbyterian Church in Oakland, California. The songs are gentle "Don't Forget Love" and "Trust In God." The songs, written by her husband, trumpeter Mondre Moffett, were recorded live at Oakland's Love Center Church.

African American families, whether broken or whole, will certainly find loving respectful messages in the lyrics as of Adam's Song" (with a vocal solo by Edward Sneed) and "Song for Jennifer" (with vocal solos by Mattis Johnson and Amos Carter.) There is both a single and extended version of "Song for Jennifer," which Horton wrote in honor of his sister. The song "Family" features a vocal solo by Anita Latin.

Big band music audiences will hear some fine jazz tenor saxophone solos by Kirt Bradford (Mustopha Hashim) - a veteran of the Jimmy Lunceford Band era — and Noel Jewkes. as well as bass solos by Spencer

In a statement relative to his new gospel jazz musical concept album producer Randall-Keith Horton said, "this first 'Big Band Gospel' album is dedicated to the family-God's family, your

family (or family-to-be), and to all who have a real hope for the healing of our nation.'
