Parade of Stars" telethon is
beamed into millions of homes
across America, viewers of the
holiday special are entertainment
by a celebrity roster that includes
many of the most accomplished
stars in show business, and cast
of promising newcomers.

That recipe for success will be repeated this year on Saturday, Dec. 26, when more than 50 celebrities take their places on center stage for the 13th annual "Parade of Stars" extravaganza. Proceeds from the star-studded show benefit the 41 private, historically Black Colleges and universities represented by the United Negro College Fund (UNCE)

The distinguished credentials of telethon host Lou Rawls is typical of the many "legends" who will appear on this year's show. Rawls, a Chicago native, has won four Grammy Awards during his career, and he has recorded one platinum and six gold albums, plus a gold single.

Rawls attributes the success of the telethon to the dynamic entertainment that is showcased each year, and the public's commitment to support educational opportunities.

"The 'Parade of Stars' is more than just a name," Rawls says. "It is a true description of what takes place for seven prime-time television hours, with support for a truly deserving cause."

The celebrity lineup for this year's show, according to Rawls, is one of the best I've ever seen." Among the mega-stars to appear this year are Michael Jackson, Whitney Houston, Frank Sinatra, Dionne Warwick, Bill Cosby and Aretha Franklin. Each of these stars has a long list of accomplishments that are sure to land

them in the music "Hall of Fame."

Michael Jackson, whose ascendancy to greatness was recently detailed in a television special about his family, will join the "Parade of Stars" for the first time. Jackson, who supports the UNCF with his own scholarship program, accounted for sales of more than 110 million records during the 1980s, including the greatest selling album of all time, "Thriller."

His most recent recording, "Dangerous," has already sold over 14 million copies worldwide, and features such hits as "Black or White," "Remember The Time," and "Jam."

Whitney Houston, another long-time supporter of the College Fund, is regarded by Many music critics as today's best female vocalist. She has won two Grammy Awards, eleven American Music Awards, and two Emmy Awards.

Her first album, "Whitney Houston," continues to be the best-selling debut album by a solo

artist, and she established an alltime record as the only artist to achieve seven consecutive #1 hits

Houston recently made her acting debut in the movie "The Bodyguard," and is a strong favorite to win an Oscar for the movie's featured song, "I Will Always Love You."

Returning to this year's "Lou Rawls Parade of Stars" lineup for a second time will be one of the world's leading performers of popular music — Frank Sinatra. Known by several nicknames, including "The Chairman of the Board" and "ol' Blue Eyes," Sinatra has received numerous honors and awards in recognition of his many charitable endeavors.

Sinatra's career, which includes acting roles in more than 50 films, some of which he produced and directed, is studded with many accolades, including Oscars, Grammys, Emmys and prestigious Peabody Award. He has played major roles in the inaugurations of American Presidents, and he continues to play to sold-out audiences around the world.

With the likes of these great entertainers, and many others, the "Lou Rawls Parade of Stars" telethon promises to be one of television's best holiday specials. The show will emanate from the Aquarius Theatre in Hollywood, and from the historic Apollo Theatre in Harlem.

Rawls's co-hosts for the show
