It is not that often that a Nevada High School athlete from the Southern Conference is mentioned in a national sports periodical, like Street and Smith's. However in the past several years, names such as: Tarkanian, Banks, Penix, Anthony and Reed have seemed to start a trend. The list grows on as the addition of four players were named as honorable mention All-American in the 1992-93 Street and Smiths Basketball Preview.

We will feature the local standouts in upcoming issues of the Sentinel, and we start with two players hailing from the same school

Sean Long and Chancellor Davis, from Cheyenne High School, have combined to create a deadly combination for the Desert Shield. The two year old expansion school arguably boasts the top school in the Sunset Division. Traditional powerhouses Clark and Western are currently viewing the Desert Shield from second place. both teams being 5-1. Chey-

Long and Davis have proved that their team is a definite contender, and they both spoke with the Sentinel in an interview earlier this week

When asked how it felt to be named as an honorable All-American, Sean said it felt "real good." He went on to say that he has always checked such magazines to see if any of his friends or cousins had made it. When he actually saw his name listed, he expressed how much of a thrill it was. Long added that there is no pressure from the

Davis echoed Long's sentiments with an added sense of accomplishment since Vegas has not been completely recognized, on the national level, for the caliber of hoopsters throughout the Southern Conference.

The pair were teammates at Chaparral before the school district added more schools to the city two years ago as the process continues. As they made their move to Cheyenne, the duo led the Desert Shield to an impressive debut season record of 15-9. Cheyenne advanced to the playoffs only to fall

ons, Rancho, in the first round.

Presently, there are several schools looking to recruit the skills of both Long and Davis. Long has been contacted by Washington, St. Mary's-California and UNLV's sister school, Nevada-Reno.

"My cousin played (at Reno) and had a successful career there," explains Long.

SMU, St. Mary's-California, Pacific and Wyoming are the schools Davis remains undecided about.

When asked if either of them would consider attending a predominantly African-American University, both exclaimed, Yes!

Grambling and Southern were an identical pair of favorites for both players. Exclusive coverage on BET Television, is what caught their eyes to the two schools

Both Long and Davis have more to offer than basketball though; Long currently maintains a 3.3 GPA, while Davis has an astounding 3.8 GPA.

Just as in every other category, both players are interested in Electrical Engineering.

A final word of advice to their peers they leave behind, in the valley, went like this: Long-"Work hard, maintain the good grades and most definitely, stay fo-
