ALLIANCE AGAINST RACIST & POLITICAL REPRESSION

As I stood with the 350,000 people protesting racist violence in Germany on November 8, the similarities there with the current situation in the United States were illuminated.

The outpouring of anti-fascist sentiments among the German people were similar to the historic turnout on election day in the United States to oust a right-wing administration from the White House. Yet, in both countries there is a long way to go in the battles to torpedo neonazi, Klan and right-wing religious fanatic elements.

The economic crisis in Germany and the United States has provided fertile soil for the ultrarightists to step up their racist and anti-Semitic actions, including terrorist attacks. In the eastern part of Germany unemployment is at 40 percent. In the United States African Americans continue to experience joblessness at rates twice those for whites. Yet with the depressed economy, the right-wing demagogic appeals to primarily blame people of color, foreign born Jewish people for the plight of white working people, have in-

tensified. What makes the situation even more serious is that the ultra-right is entrenched in the police departments and armed forces of both countries. In November in Germany 24

members of the armed forces were indicted for their roles in the racist, anti-immigrant and anti-Semitic violence. But those 24 indictments barely make a scratch on the problem within the German military. In an atmosphere when

governments have become so permissive of dehumanizing behavior one can never assume that once 2 or 24 or even 240 arrests or indictments are made of ultra-rightists in the police and armed forces that the problem

has been solved. Those few who are seen are representative of many more.

A political agenda was set at the Republican National Convention from its podium. That agenda is being sought with the most vigorous campaign

On November 17 Mississippi Governor Kirk Fordice said, "The less we emphasize the Christian religion the further we fall into the abyss of poor character and chaos in the United States of America." That outlandish statement, in a country founded on the principles of separation of church and state as well as religious freedom, is a continuation of the Republican National

In an unprecedented level of intimidation and disrespect, some Southern military officiers have said that President-elect Bill Clinton would not leave their military bases alive if he legalizes gays and lesbians in the military. Not only are blatant death threats, on which President Bush hasn't sufficiently acted, but this is an open discussion of having a coup d'etat in this country!

It was a tremendous step to oust President Bush, yet it is only a step towards taking on the ultra-right. During economic crisis there is all the more reason to fight hard to extend and defend democracy. It is a daily fight which has special meaning

in the first 100 days of the incom ing Clinton administration. That administration will either set a tone of trying to appease ultrarightists or repudiating and resisting them depending on what "we the people" do.

Ultra-right politics of division have to be met with multi-racial and multi-national unity from the people as a whole in conjunction with the labor movement organizing working people in struggle. But this unity can not be built on inclusiveness for inclusiveness

There are specific demands which must be made of the Clinton administration and which we must struggle to convince them (See NAARPR, Page 4)



Who are some of the up-andcoming young people in our community? Even for those in the know, it's pretty hard to figure out. Why? Because older, more established leaders seek and frequently get most of the media attention and exposure.

In fact, one of my biggest complaints in general about our established African-American elder leadership is that they hold on to power far longer than their ability to use it constructively to benefit us all. And they seldom take young people under their wings to groom for future leadership. Nor, in many cases do they share their power bases with anyone except their peers. The result is that most of the decisions made by Black people affecting Black people come from older minds, absent of youthful input or perspective.

Out of deference and respect for those who fit into this category, I will not name names. As ran option, I've chosen to go the other way by profiling some of the names of up-and-coming young people who I suspect will become, or in some cases already are, our future leaders.

John Rhodes - Forget his narrow defeat by Dr. McMillan for the recently vacated school board seat. This young man, only 27, has unlimited potential. I predict he will resurface politically in a big way.

Yvonne Atkinson Gates -This young women has come a long way since finishing Clark High School, earning two degrees from UNLV, having a successful stint as a school board member, and wrestling the County Commission seat away from incumbent "Doc" Pearson.
