EDDIE MURPHY AND EN VOGUE TO RECEIVE SPECIAL 1993 SOUL TRAIN MUSIC AWARDS

Los Angeles, CA- International motion picture superstar Eddie Murphy and recording superstars En Vogue have been announced as special honorees at the Seventh Annual Soul Train Music Awards. Murphy was named recipient of the prestigious Heritage Award for career achievements, and En Vogue will be honored with the Sammy Davis, Jr. Award as Entertainer of the Year, according to the the program's executive producer Don Cornelius. The awards will be presented during the live twohour telecast of the 1993 Soul Train Music Awards, hosted by Luther Vandross, Patti LaBelle and Natalie Cole, from the Los Angeles Shrine Auditorium, Tuesday, March 9, 1993, 8 - 10 p.m. (EST.)

Murphy, in just over a decade, has established himself as one of the true giants in the entertainment industry. This past year he was named NATO/ ShowWest "Star of the Decade," retaining his rating as the world's No.1 film star. Since debuting in the box office hit, "48 Hrs." for Paramont Pictures in 1982, Murphy has starred in eleven motion pictures compiling a staggering worldwide film gross surpassing \$1-billion dollars. Some of Murphy's top grossing and most important films include, "Another 48 Hrs.," "Trading Places," "Beverly Hills Cop," "Beverly Hill Cop II," "Coming To America," "Harlem Nights" and this year's classy and highlyacclaimed "Boomerang."

En Vogue, the Californiabased female sensations comprised of Dawn Robinson, Terry Ellis, Cindy Herron, and Maxine Jones, burst onto the music scene with their platinum selling smash hit, "Hold On" from their Atlantic Records' platinum album, "Born to Sing." This year the divas have enjoyed a string of hit singles from their second album, "Funky Divas" which is on its way to triple platinum. They also just completed a sold out, 26 city, national concert tour, their first as headliners, which has firmly secured their status as major R&B/Pop superstars.

"En Vogue has set a new standard for female groups," praised Cornelius. "Over the past year they have made the most dramatic across-the-board impact of any artist through the tremendous success of their innovative music videos, stage performances and record sales, and as a group, they are extremely deserving of the Sammy Davis Jr. Award as entertainers of the year."

En Vogue joins previous Sammy Davis Jr. Award honorees Janet Jackson, M.C. Hammer, Michael Jackson, and Arsenio Hall.

"Eddie Murphy is without a doubt one of the most successful African-American entertainers of our times," commented Cornelius. "The impact of his comedy characters on Saturday Night Live are legendary and his ongoing career contributions as a motion picture actor, comedian, recording artist, entrepreneur and humanitarian are simply incomparable for an individual of his age," he added.

Murphy's meteoric rise to international superstardom, at age 31, is indeed remarkable, and he joins previous Heritage Award recipients Prince, Michael Jackson, Stevie Wonder, Gla-

Jones and Smokey Robinson. In addition to his phenomenal record-breaking and awardwinning success as a motion picture actor and box office giant, Murphy has also recorded two albums for CBS records, completed sold out concert tours and developed several companies to facilitate an array of motion picture and television projects including: Eddie Murphy Productions, Eddie Murphy Television Productions, and Eddie Murphy Television Enterprises Ltd., a separate entity which produces series pilots and specials for network television through an agreement with CBS.

Murphy's companies have also been in the forefront of Hollywood in providing opportunities for African-American "behind-the-scenes" talent such as writers, producers and directors. He has also vigorously supported, among other charitable causes, the AIDS Foundation, served as a former Honorary Chairman of the United Negro College Fund, "Lou Rawls Parade of Stars" telethon, and currently chairs the Paramount/ Eddie Murphy Fellowship, a minority outreach effort administered by Eddie Murphy Productions and Paramount.

Adding to the STMA star power this year is multiple

Grammy Award winning songstress Natalie Cole, who joins repeating co-hosts Vandross and LaBelle. The official STMA nominations honoring the top rhythm & blues, jazz, gospel, and rap artists in twelve categories will be announced Tuesday, February 2, at Hotel Bel-Air in Los Angeles, CA.

The seventh annual Soul Train Awards will be telecast live to 90 percent of the country, though syndication by the Tribune Entertainment Company.
Cornelius will be co-producing with Anthony Sabitino, Ron de Moraes of "Entertainment Tonight" will direct, and George Duke will serve as musical director.
