

CHARGERS OBTAIN BIG VICTORY IN EARLY SEASON MUST-WIN SITUATION

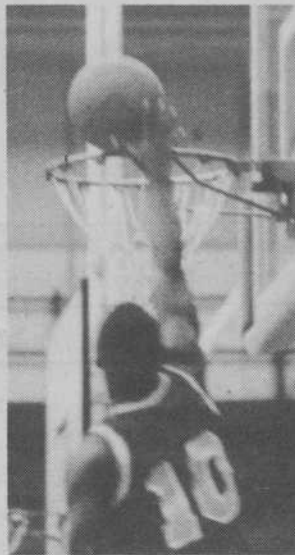

A battle it was, in the Sunset Division Tuesday afternoon, when the Clark Chargers and Western Warriors faced each other in a must-win situation. With both teams cluttered amongst the middle of the standings, with a 1-2 league record, the high-scoring teams put on quite a show for those in attendance at Clark High School.

From the opening tip, the Chargers stormed off and seemed to never look back as they toppled the Warriors 103-90. Clark improved to 2-1 and 11-6 overall, while Western fell to 1-3, and 12-7 overall.

Leading the way for the Chargers was point guard James Boykin who canned six 3-pointers en route to a 26 point performance. Jermon Riley added 24 and Kevin Bell hit for 21.

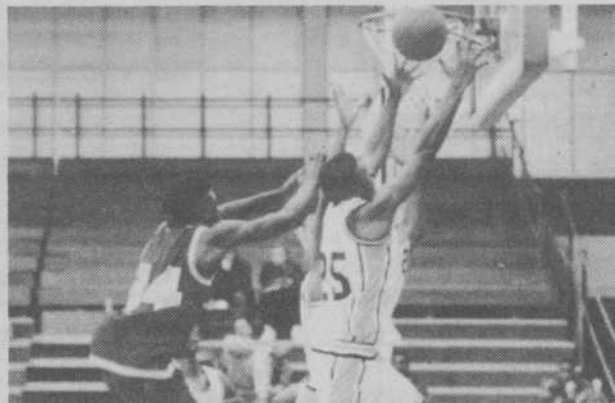
Clark's scrappy "D" appeared to unnerve the Western quintet that includes stellar guard Prince Fowler, who tossed in 16 first-half points. Fowler's perform-

ance wasn't enough though, as Clark maintained a thirteen point advantage at the intermission.

The Chargers got their second wind and stormed out for the second half to take a 23-point lead with 4:25 remaining in the third period. Western came back

with a furious 19-2 run to pull within 12 behind some tenacious defense and bulls-eye shooting from Fowler, who continued to launch the rock from three-point-ville. Tyrell Jamerson added to the cause by drilling a few outside the perimeter on the way to a 28-point performance. Western could only get as close as eight as time ticked away and the Chargers rolled on to victory.

Clark moved into a 4th-place tie with Cimarron behind Cheyenne, Gorman and Bonanza.

have made up for the vacancies with the addition of Othella Harrington and Duane Spencer.

Harrington is averaging 20.0 ppg., while pulling down 10.1 rpg. The standout freshman has led the Hoyas in nine of thirteen games in scoring. He is coming off of a 22-point performance against Connecticut this past Monday.

Co-starring for Georgetown this season is junior forward Robert Churchwell, who is averaging 13.2 ppg, and 6.4 rpg.

Churchwell scored a career-high 25 points against UCONN.

G'Town is 3-1 on the road, 1-0 against non-conference opponents. The Hoyas lone non-conference road win came at the expense of Big West member Cal-Irvine 64-60 behind the explosive play of Spencer, who irritated the Anteaters for 20 points and 11 rebounds. The Runnin' Rebels throttled UC Irvine 115-97 at the Thomas and Mack in December, sparked by Rider's 27 points.

UNLV G/F/C Evric Gray was

injured on a play that fouled him out of the game, when he and A&M forward Brett Murry collided. Gray didn't seem worried about having to sit out due to the injury.

"We banged knees, it's just bruised" Gray said after the game.

"We'll have to step up our game for Georgetown. Yeah they're tough, but I love challenges. I can't wait for Georgetown."
