Coach Mass seemed to be in his glory following UNLV's 96-80 whipping of Georgetown. Although the 16-point margin might seem big, UNLV was actually up by 27 before Massimino emptied the bench near the end of the game. Coach Mass had no regrets putting his reserves in the final 2 minutes of the game, when the Hoyas popped 11 unanswered points to shrink UNLV's lead from 96-69 to the eventual final.

"My philosophy is everyone who practices should have the opportunity to play," Coach Mass said. "I think that's very important."

The man responsible for much of the hard labor under the basket though, has been Evric Gray. Now that 6'9" junior Danny Griffin has transferred to Rhode Island, Gray is the tallest Rebel on the roster, standing 6'7"

"His whole demeanor is out standing," said Massimino about his 6'7" center. "I think (Evric) played his best game today (against G'Town). He defended Othella Harrington great. The little things he did all add up. It was the little things that won this game for us.

Gray certainly enjoyed himself, mixing it up with Harrington underneath the basket.

"I feel great to be back on TV," expressed Gray, after returning to CBS last Saturday after UNLV's two-year TV ban. "(Othella) is very strong. He is going to be a great player. It was a challenge, but I love chal-

Gray went on to say that he liked playing with this year's squad better than any other. But there was that other team he was on as a freshman. Same school, different players though. Larry Johnson, Stacey Augmon, Greg Anthony - you know, those guys. Evric just smiled, and thought to himself.

"That was a great team I played on," he added.

UNLV is now embarking on their longest stint from home this year, 3 games in 8 days. They begin their journey in Northern Nevada. The Rebels will face Nevada in a Big West game tonight.

The Wolfpack are currently 7-7 overall, 2-5 in BWC. UNLV is 11-1 and 4-1 In BWC. UNLV leads the series 39-10 but are playing Nevada for the first time ever in conference play. The Rebels have won eight straight over the 'Pack and 13 of the past 14. Since topping Kansas State on December 28, highlighting a 3-game winning streak, Nevada has lost 5 of its last 7 games. UNLV's only defeat of the season came at the hands of Long Beach State, who has been opening eyes all season. LBSU beat #1 Kansas this past Monday 64-49.

The Rebels will continue their road trip in Utah, where they'll face Utah State for the first time this season. The Rebels hold a 21-0 advantage in the series, but always seem to struggle en route to victory against the (See UNLV, Page 15)


