Bill Russell dominated play during the 1960's as a defensive and rebounding specialst. Russell led the Boston Celtics to 10 straight NBA championships.

Oscar Robertson was another big player of the '60's, starring for the Cincinnati Royals and was labeled the game's first "big" quard.


