Rahab was a Black woman from a Canaanite city called Jericho, which was surrounded by such popular Hamite cities as Gibeon, Beeroth and Jerusalem.

When Joshua sent spies into Rahab's City, she hid them in a thread stock on her roof. Rahab had heard about these Jews and their God who rescued them from Africa.

and their foes in Canaan. She knew her people could not withstand their strength, so out of fear, Rahab concealed the spies and began to bargain with them concerning security. She pleaded with them to spare her and other kinsmen during the seizure of Jericho. The two men agreed to spare her life as well as the Kinsmen if she did not reveal their plans to the King. Before they departed they warned her that upon there return she should remain in her quarters with a scarlet cord hanging from her window, and they would soare their lives.

The messengers journied to camp and advised Joshua, who prepared to overthrow Jericho, for which God had instructed him as to the manner in which to take the city. It was done, but Rahab and her Kinsmen were spared.

Rahab lived among the Israelites, and there she married a Jew by the name of Salmon (an ancestor of Jesus Christ) and to this union a child was born called Boaz
