Westin Bonaventure Hotel, June 3 - 6, 1993

This year's 2-city tour will also travel to the Bay area where Terry McMillan, author of the run-away best seller, Waiting to Exhale, and the critically acclaimed Mama and Disappearing Acts, will open the Oakland conference at the Oakland Convention Center, October 21-24, 1993. Produced by San Diego promotions firm, PROMOTrends, the AAWC on Tour is a 4-day, high-impact empowerment conference, created to meet the special needs of African American women, families and communities.

Other distinguished keynote presenters include writer/producer/ director Attallah Shabazz, eldest daughter of the late Malcolm X; Black Enterprises Editor-in-Chief Sheryl Hilliard Tucker; Bebe Moore Campbell, author of best seller Your Blues Ain't Like Mine; noted orator Patricia Russell-McCloud, Esq.; economist Dr. Julianne Malveaux and Iyanla Vanzant, author of Tapping the Power Within.

AAWC on Tour offers over 80 workshops presented by nationally noted African American experts in the fields of holistic health, selfempowerment, business development, family relations and career development. Other conference events include theater, dance and musical performances; the Village Marketplace featuring over 100 vendors; rites of passage sessions for both girls and women; and two special luncheon forums on "Black Images in the Media" and "X" Mania: Who Wins and Who Loses in the Black Marketplace. facilitated by Lee Bailey of RadioScope.

According to executive producer Maria Carothers, "After attending several 'general' women's conferences - very Anglo and very grey flannel suit-oriented - I decided back in 1987 to design a national conference to meet our unique needs as Black women."

LAS VEGAS - On Saturday, March 13th, girls from all over Nevada can attend a conference geared to increasing their interest in taking more math and science in order to prepare for expanded career options. The Expanding Your Horizons in Science and Mathematics Conference will be held from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at UNLV. A new addition to this year's conference will be a post conference "Model Mixer" from 1-2 p.m., where girls and their parents will have an opportunity to meet the speakers, ask questions, and get more information.

This year's keynote speakers will be Mary Lozano, a space engineer from the McDonnell-Douglas Space Lab, and Joan Turner, a NASA Space Ambassador and a Clark County school teacher. Over 40 workshops are scheduled to spark the interest of young women in science and math related careers, such as "Shake, Rattle & Roll. Earth-

quakes and Volcanos," and "Or Would You Rather Be a Fish?" with exciting hands-on experiences of actual career activities. Many local professional women will be on "Guess My Job" panels to serve as role models and discuss career preparation.

Last year over 15,800 girls across the nation attended Expanding Your Horizons in Science and Mathematic conferences. Approximately twothirds were in grades six through eight and one-third in grades nine through twelve. A recent research report prepared by the American Association of University Women confirmed that the middle school years are critical for the self-esteem of young women. Typically, girls drop or quit taking mathematic and science courses earlier than boys. The long-term result of this decision is that these girls do not have as many career options available to them.
