

THE EIGHTH ANNUAL CORPORATE CHALLENGE TO COMMENCE MARCH 27

Opening ceremonies for the eighth annual Corporate Challenge take place Saturday, March 27 at Freedom Park (No. Mojave Rd. at E. Washington Ave.) Sponsored by the City of Las Vegas Department of Parks and Leisure Activities, Corporate Challenge is an Olympic-style competition designed to promote health and fitness in the workplace, while creating spirit and morale among employees.

Lighting of the Corporate Challenge torch takes place at 8 a.m., Friday, March 26 at City Hall Plaza, 400 E. Stewart Ave., officially kicking off the Torch Relay. The Corporate Challenge Torch Relay consists of a group of competitors from each corporate team carrying the torch and running a segment of the route throughout the community. The torch will ultimately arrive at Freedom Park on Saturday, lighting the Corporate Challenge calderon and officially opening the 1993 games.

During the six-week period, contests take place in 27 different sporting and athletic events throughout the community. Competition includes individual, single/pair, and team events.

Corporations are categorized into one of four divisions according to their employee base. Division A is for companies with over 2,000 employees, Division B is for 1,000-2,000 employees, while Division C is for 300-999 employees, and Division D is for companies with less than 300 employees.

Closing ceremonies take place Saturday, May 1, again at Freedom Park, at which time all awards will be presented. Parks and Leisure Activities Director, Dave Kuiper, invites the general public out to watch the games, reminding everyone that all events, including opening and closing ceremonies, are free to spectators.

Garcia, who fights out of North Hollywood, California, is ranked among the top 10 heavyweights by the World Boxing Council, World Boxing Association and the International Boxing Federation. He will enter the scheduled 12-round bout with a 30-1 mark with 24 knockouts. Since suffering his only loss in 1988, the 31-year-old Garcia has won 19 straight fights, 16 by knockout.

Garcia captured the NABF title on February 16 in Denver when he knocked out Mike Williams in the fifth round. He also holds the WBC Continental Americas heavyweight title, winning that last December with a 12-round decision over Jerry Jones. Garcia has also defeated the likes of Mike Evans, Mike "Giant" White and Ossie Ocasio.

Headlining the undercard will be World Boxing Organization junior middleweight champion John David Jackson, who will be fighting in a 10-round non-title bout. Jackson, who fights out of Denver, is 28-0 with 16 knockouts. He has held the WBO title since December of 1988 when he stopped former WBC junior welterweight champion Lupe Aquino in the eighth round.

Also featured on the card will be undefeated flyweight champion Eric Griffin, who will fight in a scheduled eight-rounder. Griffin, from Jasper, Tennessee, is 7-0 with six knockouts. Other fighters featured on the card include undefeated light heavyweight Ole Klemetsen, Las Vegas middleweight Miguel Jimenez and junior flyweight Joey Smith of Las Vegas, who will make his professional debut in a scheduled four-rounder.

Doors to the Riviera Convention Center will open at 4 p.m. with the first bout scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. Tickets for the card are priced at \$15 for general admission, \$25 for reserved seating and \$50 ringside. Tickets may be purchased at the Riviera Box Office located in the main casino from 8:30 a.m. to 11:45 p.m. Information can be obtained by calling (702) 794-9433.
