

Unless you've been living under a rock for the last several months you should know who Shabba is. Shabba Ranks is of course the top "dance hall" reggae rap artist in the world. Shabba's latest album, "X-tra Naked" easily won a Grammy as as reggae's best album of the year.

This relatively new form of Third World rap music has taken the country by storm. Dance Hall music is popularized in many reggae beat records where the main singer sings a song while Shabba seductively raps as background underneath and intertwined with the main vocals. The Shabba formula has proven extremely successful. especially for such singing artists as Eddie Murphy, Johnny Gill and Maxi Priest.

But it's another dimension of Shabba that I want to discuss. Lately, Shabba's stock has gone down considerably; and it's because of some unintended but negative comments he made about gays on a London TV show. Shabba supposedly said gays represent an unnatural condition-one that God Himself rejects. As a religious person, Shabba explained, he could not accept nor embrace gays.

Almost immediately, like a ton of bricks, Shabba became a focal point of criticism. A scheduled appearance on the Tonight Show was cancelled. Several lucrative performances, including one in Las Vegas at the Aladdin Theater with Bobby Brown, were put on indefinite hold or cancelled.

In one fell swoop, Shabba became persona non grata. If you recall, Shabba was playfully spoofed on a previous episode of "In Living Color" which made light, in jest, of his coarse looks. In real life though, Shabba's appearance doesn't phase scantily-clad females appearing in his videos who cater to his seductively playful macho

For the time being it appears Shabba has laid the controversy he created to rest by agreeing to appear in an anti-gay bashing public service message

But the underlying message here for Shabba and the rest of us is that if you are an entertainer on the world stage you might get burned if you stick your neck out and give your own personal opinion

If you sing, sing. If you rap, rap. But don't say anything of substance. Keep your opinions to yourself or be prepared to suffer the probable consequences.
