Issue of Race," he persued one of his major themes, his perception that the Black American agenda has moved away from emphasizing politics to one of economic empowerment. "Poverty," he says, " is the primary problem facing Blacks." Discrimination in hiring, he says, will damage the nation's economic future when our competitive survival depends upon hiring the best employees from a work force that is increasingly nonwhite.

In addition to commemorating the end of racial segregation in Las Vegas casinos and show-rooms, the program is held in conjunction with the opening of a new exhibit at the Nevada State Museum and Historical Society in Lorenzi Park which depicts the Moulin Rouge Hotel and Casino during it's heyday in 1955 as an elegant inter-racial resort, the first of it's kind in the country.
