for the homeless. She will speak at the conference's plenary session on educational issues.

Both the religious establish-

ment and the women's movement will be challenged to respond to the diversity of women's experience. Describing the reality of Hispanic women in

relation to established religion, Ms. Teresita Basso of Moreno Valley, CA said that "spirituality for many Hispanic women has less to do with rules, commandments and the institutional church and more to do with a personal relationship to God based in concrete experience and the context of a caring community." As a result, she continues, "Hispanic women will continue to challenge both institutional churches and the

women's movement to understand their lived reality and make room for diverse spiritualities." Ms. Basso, who teaches 5th grade in an inner city school in Riverside County, CA, will speak at the conference's plenary session on women's spiritualities.

Other topics to be addressed include; Economics, Jobs and Employment, Black Women in Politics, Breast Cancer, Co-Dependency and Alcoholism, Violence Against Women in the Media, Refugee Women, White Privilege in a Racist Society, Older Women's Issues, Ecology, Reproductive Issues, Surviving Incest and many more.
