March 25, 1993 AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY HAM: THE FATHER OF BLACK/AFRICAN PEOPLES By Gwen Walker

Ham was the middle child of Noah's three sons, "Shem, Ham, and Japheth" (Genesis 5:32;6:10;7:13;9:18,22;10:1,6;20;1 Chronicles 1:4,8). The name "Ham" means hot or heat, and by application means "Black."

Ham was the only son of Noah after whom a country/nation was named. Concerning neither Shem nor Japheth was there a biblical people who could claim either as

their namesake. The name Ham" is patronymic of his descendants, meaning it is a name received from a paternal ancestor. With reference to the people of Ham, the son of Noah, "Ham" is found several other times in the scripture: (1 Chronicles 4:40; Psalm 78:51; 105:23; 105:27, 106:22).

"Ham" has also another biblical meaning. Besides Egypt, "Ham" is also a place located in the land of Canaan. This usage is found in Genesis 14:5 and also in Chronicles 4:40. Ham in Canaan was located in Transjordan (east of the Jordan) and served as the home of a people called the Zuzim. It was in this territory that the Elamite King, Chedorlaomet, and the kings with him, defeated the people of Zuzim.

1 Chronicles 4:40 is most enlightening. This verse indicates that the people of Ham positively affected their environment to the extent that their land was rich, good pasture land; it was very broad, quiet, and peaceful... for the former inhabitants there belonged to Ham.

The descendants of Simeon came to live in this Hamitic territory when the Isrealite nation came to conquer and settle Canaan land.
