By Al Triche Hatred is a sin, but anger, provided it is not merely a symptom of

a vengeful heart, is not sinful at all. In fact, righteous anger, if properly directed, is not only justifiable but can also be quite productive. We African-Americans have learned this lesson the hard way, in large part due to deceptions accomplished throughout history by way of calculated perversion of Christianity. Religion, and the teachings of Jesus in particular, have been used with great success to divert the passions of black people in America from a yearning for freedom to passive acceptance of oppression.

Religion was abused by white clerics who baptized captive Africans enroute to slave ships and engaged in self-delusion by desecrating a sacrament while claiming to be "converting the heathens." The Almighty God saw this and was surely angered by such abomination. Once on the plantations, our ancestors were fed a steady diet of false teaching disguised as Christian doctrine, done for the purpose of focusing the slaves' attention on "pie-in-the-sky" and away from the quest for liberation. They were brainwashed to believe they were sheep to follow a theoretical "good shepherd" who, in the oppressor's scheme, encouraged them to reject violent resistance to enslavement, practice mindless obedience, and endure all manner of suffering and degradation in the name of a God who would have them submit to earthly hell at the hands of heretics, in exchange for heavenly relief, but


only after death. They were taught to neither expect, nor seek deliverance in this life, but instead to accept, in the Name of Christ, evil visited upon them by servants of Satan. Jesus saw this bastardization of His Gospel, and was surely angered at what took place.

Today we are still being confused by devious charlatans and misguided incompetents, whites and, sadly, many black as well. We are angered by this; and if we are not, we should be, for it serves only the oppressors' purposes when we take the "sheep" analogy too literally. We become, not followers of the true "Good Shepard", but instead pray for the wolves, who have their own plans for sheep, none of which involve liberation, salvation or heaven.

These are worthless ministers, worthless and dangerous. They are not our friends, and if their preaching does not in some way advance the cause of liberation in this world in which we presently live, they are our enemies. They have their own motives which are not Christ-inspired. These are people that St. Paul describes as "...lovers of self and of money, proud, arrogant, abusive,...inhuman...slanderous, licentious, brutal, hating the good. They will be treacherous, reckless pompous lovers of pleasure rather than of God as they make a pretense of religion but negate its power." (2 Tim. 3:2-5)
