That's when internationally renown actor Greg-Alan Williams who plays the co-starring role of tough but loveable Sqt. Elerbeen on the popular internationally syndicated "Baywatch" television series will present a premier benefit performance, and play the title role in the PBS Award winning play, "The Life and times of Deacon A. L. Wiley" to benefit the New Revelation Community Outreach Center of Pasadena. located at 855 North Orange Grove Boulevard.

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This benefit performance for the Pasadena Youth Center will climax Greq's '93 national tour of the production that was launched in February at the Great American History Theater in St. Paul, Minn., and wrapped the end of March with a record and Greg's performance as

breaking week long run in Atlanta, Ga., as a Jomondie Theater production after playing to record breaking audiences in various cities and at black college campuses across the country.

Proceeds from this benefit performance will help the center operate their programs offering aid and assistance at all learning levels. Excerpts from the review are as follows, "Williams, as Deacon Wiley, enters by greeting audience members as he would a congregation, turning the clock back to 1904 and setting the stage for a relaxed and expansive Sunday-evening church meeting. Wiley begins to testify, telling how he came to Los Angeles, and of his childhood on a plantation.

He draws detailed, striking pictures of life under slavery, down to the clothing he wore. and games he played as a child. But Wiley's pain ultimately cuts through his nostalgia, as he remembers the scars on his mothers back and a brother sold away from the family.

One suspects that there is a lot of Williams himself in Deacon Wiley, whose messages underscore self-worth, responsibility and the family. But Wiley doesn't pretend to be a preacher.

What he offers is not a sermon, but his own rich store of parables, penetrating observations, and heartfelt sorrows.

Williams the author gives a generous and moving performance as Wiley; he has the un-

forced, flowing style of a born storyteller, sketching in a few words or gestures a host of characters like Tim the overseer. a freedman who becomes a slave again to alcohol, or the successful sharecropper who refuses to teach his fellows how to figure.

Though it is virtually a oneman show, Williams receives outstanding musical backup from Billy Washington, as Brother Hudson, and the audience-ascongregation is pulled in as well, on several rounds of "Jacobs Ladder "

This benefit performance to aid the financial concerns of the New Revelation Youth Center of Pasadena is another example of Greg's willingness to aid and assist others. Risking his life to rescue Japanese-American, Takao Hirato from an angry mob during last years riots in Los Angeles was a paramount!!

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

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
